

From the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)



The Liturgy of the Eucharist

265. In the Liturgy of the Eucharist, everything is done as at Mass with the people, except for the following.

266. After the acclamation at the end of the embolism that follows the Lord's Prayer, the Priest says the prayer Domine Iesu Christe, qui dixisti (Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles). He then adds, The peace of the Lord be with you always, to which the minister replies, And with your spirit. If appropriate, the Priest gives the Sign of Peace to the minister.

267. Then, while he says the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) with the minister, the Priest breaks the host over the paten. After the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God), he performs the commingling, saying quietly the prayer Haec commixtio (May this mingling).

268. After the commingling, the Priest quietly says either the prayer Domine Iesu Christe, Fili Dei vivi (Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God) or the prayer Perceptio Corporis et Sanguinis tui (Mav the receiving of your Body and Blood). Then he genuflects, takes the host, and, if the minister is to receive Communion, turns to the minister and, holding the host a little above the paten or the chalice, says the Ecce Agnus Dei (Behold the Lamb of God), adding with the minister, Lord, I am not worthy. Then facing the altar, the Priest partakes of the Body of Christ. If, however, the minister does not receive Communion, the Priest, after genuflecting, takes the host and, facing the altar, says quietly, Lord, I am not worthy, etc., and the Corpus Christi custodiat me in vitam aeternam (May the Body of Christ keep me safe for eternal life), and consumes the Body of Christ. Then he takes a(May the Blood of Christ keep me safe for eternal life), and consumes the Blood of Christ.

De la Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR)

Liturgia eucarística

265. En la liturgia eucarística todo se realiza como en la Misa con el pueblo, a excepción de lo que sigue.

266. Terminada la aclamación final del embolismo que sigue al Padrenuestro, el sacerdote dice la oración Señor Jesucristo, que dijiste; y luego añade: La paz del Señor esté siempre con ustedes, a lo que el ministro responde: Y con tu espíritu. Si parece conveniente, el sacerdote puede dar la paz al ministro.

267. Luego, mientras con el ministro dice el Cordero de Dios, el sacerdote parte la hostia sobre la patena. Terminado el Cordero de Dios, hace la inmixtión, diciendo en secreto: El Cuerpo y la Sangre.

268. Después de la inmixtión, el sacerdote dice en secreto la oración Señor Jesucristo, Hijo de Dios vivo, o bien Señor Jesucristo, la comunión de tu Cuerpo; después hace la genuflexión, toma la hostia y, si el ministro va a recibir la Comunión, volviéndose a él y teniendo la hostia un poco elevada sobre la patena o el cáliz, dice: Éste es el Cordero de Dios; y, juntamente con el ministro, dice: Señor, no soy digno. A continuación, vuelto al altar, comulga el Cuerpo de Cristo. Si el ministro no recibe la Comunión, el sacerdote, una vez hecha la genuflexión, toma la hostia y, vuelto al altar, dice en secreto: Señor, no soy digno, y El Cuerpo de Cristo me guarde, y comulga el Cuerpo de Cristo. Después toma el cáliz y dice en secreto: La Sangre de Cristo me guarde, y bebe la Sangre de Cristo.

CCC - II. The Mysteries of Jesus' Infancy and Hidden Life

The Baptism of Jesus cont.

The baptism of Jesus is on his part the acceptance and inauguration of his mission as God's suffering Servant. He allows himself to be numbered among sinners; he is already "the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world."232 Already he is anticipating the "baptism" of his bloody death.233 Already he is coming to "fulfill all righteousness," that is, he is submitting himself entirely to his Father's will: out of love he consents to this baptism of death for the remission of our sins.234 The Father's voice responds to the Son's acceptance, proclaiming his entire delight in his Son.235 The Spirit whom Jesus possessed in fullness from his conception comes to "rest on him." 236 Jesus will be the source of the Spirit for all mankind. At his baptism "the heavens were opened"237—the heavens that Adam's sin had closed and the waters were sanctified by the descent of Jesus and the Spirit, a prelude to the new creation. (606, 1224, 444, 727, 739)

Through Baptism the Christian is sacramentally assimilated to Jesus, who in his own baptism anticipates his death and resurrection. The Christian must enter into this mystery of humble self-abasement and repentance, go down into the water with Jesus in order to rise with him, be reborn of water and the Spirit so as to become the Father's beloved son in the Son and "walk in newness of life":238 (1262, 628)

Let us be buried with Christ by Baptism to rise with him; let us go down with him to be raised with him; and let us rise with him to be glorified with him.239

Everything that happened to Christ lets us know that, after the bath of water, the Holy Spirit swoops down upon us from high heaven and that, adopted by the Father's voice, we become sons of God.240"
